Call for Papers & Presentations

Technical Scope



The technical scope outlines areas against which abstracts will be reviewed to help you write a successful submission.

All papers and presentations which are selected and presented at the event will be published by the IAM as part of the event proceedings.

Focus

Submissions should cover any aspect of the entire scope of the asset management discipline, beyond the management of physical assets.

Abstracts should focus on beneficial outcomes of a project or academic research that demonstrates theories concentrating on the establishment, implementation or improvement of asset management.

Emphasis should be on real case studies or scenarios, innovative technologies, tools and techniques or efforts that have concluded with an important outcome.

Please be aware that for consultants, the focus should be on the client activity and beneficial result, with a clear but muted note on how your company has helped, and any sales pitches will be rejected.

Key terms

The following terms should be used to help highlight the benefits derived:

Professionalism: consistently meeting or exceeding challenging objectives to ensure the successful application of an asset management system, demonstrating a quality approach through organisational values and working practices.

Excellence: evidence of meeting or exceeding requirements and expectations of internal and/or external customers, clients, end-users or employees.

Innovation: using innovative approaches or technologies to enhance the organisation.

Measurable success: demonstrating quantifiable performance improvements for the organisation through the achievement of key objectives and successful delivery of a system.

Topic areas

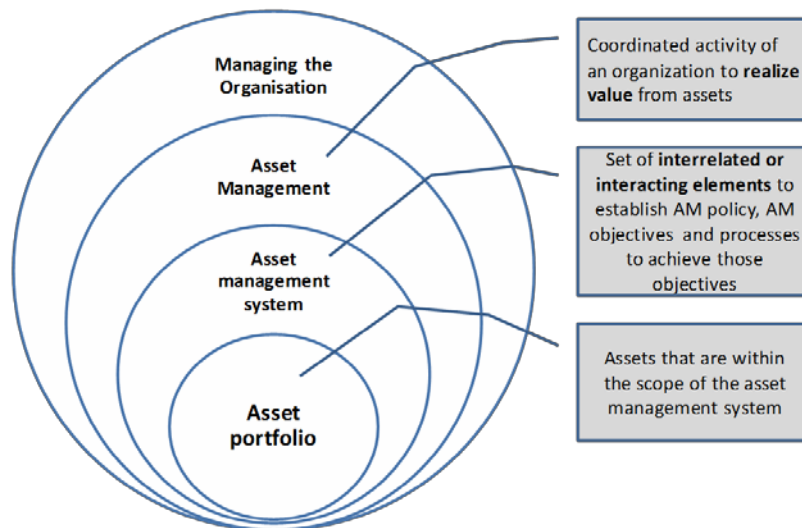


Figure 2: "Alignment of the 39 Asset Management Landscape Subjects with the six Subject Groups", *Asset Management - an Anatomy*, p17

Submissions should consider topics outlined in the ISO 55000, BSI PAS 55, or *Asset Management - an anatomy*. Examples could be the management system, or a focus on a specific area from the 39 subjects (Figure 2). Submissions are not limited to these areas but should attempt to align with them.
