

- Cultural identity that is inclined to collaboration and practical solutions, "Git ur dun"












Introduction to the NBII

Evidence Gathering & Investigations

Collect data, conduct applied research, and publish reports to support infrastructure owners with evidence-based policy and decision-making; evaluate the impact of policy and funding decisions.



Education & Training

Provide current and future owners with the training and knowledge to effectively plan, manage, and deliver infrastructure; support best management practices and training across the province.



Collaboration & Community Building

Host regular summits and seminars on various infrastructure topics, giving industry stakeholders and policy makers an opportunity to collaborate across government, industry, and academia






Interactive Dashboard




