
ISO55000 definition of Asset Management






GFMAM Asset Management Landscape vs 3 launched 5th June



Subject Groupings for Working Groups



One

Context and stakeholders

The organisation context and stakeholder subjects. These should be subjects that set the boundary conditions that inform the approach to AM within an organisation.

Two

Governance

The subjects relating to Governance and the management of AM within an organisation. Including the AM system approach taken by the organisation.

Three

AM Planning

The subjects relating to the AM planning and approach taken by the organisation.

Leadership and people

Four

The people related subjects. Including AM leadership, resourcing and competence that inform the culture of an organisation.

Five

Information

The information related subjects applicable to AM. Including the way information is managed as an asset and the importance to AM decision making.

Six

Delivery

The subjects relating to Life cycle delivery of AM.

Seven

Value realization

The subjects relating to how value is created through doing AM.

Subjects related to measuring outcomes and continual improvement, not just performance of assets



The Second Edition in 2014 made significant progress in applying asset management globally and became a reference for developing asset management knowledge.

The **Third Edition**, presented here, reflects updates to address modern challenges like climate change, including new subjects like Governance and Value Realization to align asset management with contemporary governance standards and ensure value creation.







Design Principles for Anatomy 4


- The content should align with the structure of the IAM's 10 box conceptual model
- 2. The content should align with the content of the **GFMAM Landscape vs 3**
- The content should reflect lessons learned & good industry practice from the SSGs
- 4. The content should align with the work of the hot topic working groups (digital, climate & resilience)
- 5. The content should align with the maturity guidance provided in the IAM's Pathways to Excellence
- 6. Diagrams should be used to explain core concepts
- The content should be able to be unambiguously translated into the core Anatomy languages
- 8. The content should align with (or at least not contradict) the **Draft 2024** ISO 55000/1/2 and ISO550010-13
- 9. The benefit of any proposed change should be assessed against the consequences of change to the **IAM's knowledge base**








IAM Big Picture
